
Long Island Black Artists Association



The Long Island Black Artists Association was founded in 1968 by James Counts, Ernest Snell, Raymond Miles, and Charles Winslow. Its purpose is to help African-American artists exhibit their work, and the association has continually sought new venues locally, nationally and internationally for its members' work. It has also encouraged the artist's individual efforts to find recognition.

The organization also provides an atmosphere of fellowship in which professional and semi-professional artists could exchange ideas, techniques and mutual support in the field of visual arts; to discover potential talent; to provide a cultural service to the community and offer a "sensitive environment" for the cultural expression of the larger African-American community.
