We so appreciate their constant efforts over the years and will certainly be calling on their knowledge and expertise in the coming months as the committee transitions to new leadership. Thank you, Joe and Rita!

One of the many tasks that Joe performed for the Thrift Shop was keeping track of sales tax and making bank deposits. The board is grateful to Lisa Bryson-Brockmann, our already hard-working SNUUC office manager, for graciously **volunteering** to perform this task for the congregation in coming year.

In the meantime, Bonny Levenson, who is the chair of the recently formed Thrift Shop Visioning Task Force, has taken a leadership role in organizing Thrift Shop meetings. We certainly appreciate her continuing efforts!

Many of you may have heard that the Thrift Shop's landlord is in foreclosure. Although this development may eventually have an impact on our operations, our tenancy is not in immediate danger.

Finally, the Board of Trustees spent some time relaxing this summer, with a barbecue held at my home for the July meeting, when we also met with Bonny Levenson to answer questions from the Thrift Shop Visioning Task Force as it works on its planning mission.

At the August board meeting, which I did not attend, our treasurer, Tom Weingarten, presented a final report for the 2008-09 fiscal year. He reported that the 2008-2009 operational budget was closed by our bookkeeper with a reported \$1,903 deficit, compared to an originally approved \$18,855 deficit budget. The Board of Trustees is grateful for the congregation's financial stewardship, as well as gifts from friends and former congregants, that continue to fund our dreams.

I'm looking forward to a year of fun and, yes, hard work -- whose reward will be the growing of our SNUUC family.
