Veronica Underhill has put together a first draft of an event handbook, so it will be really easy to invite more people to participate in pulling this amazing event off. For as much as these activities take a lot of work, it is precisely working on activities that helps build lasting relationships. It's kind of funny that way—that these events support the congregation in more ways that one.

Finishing up the year, the Membership Committee is planning a New Member Sunday on May 31, with a service of recognition and a new member orientation and lunch following the service. If you're not a new member and want a refresher on Unitarian Universalism, let me know and I'll be happy to put you on the attendance list.

Additionally, the Transition Team, in collaboration with the choir, will be hosting a Service of Remembrance on June 12 beginning at 7:30 pm. We will create a warm and safe space for people to share feelings—positive or negative—about the ending of this significant SNUUC ministry.

With the Bridging Ceremony on June 14 and the Congregational Picnic, we'll wrap up the 2014-2015 year.

Your Board of Trustees continues to navigate SNUUC through these seas of transition and change with the able assistance and guidance of our Transition Minister, Laurie Stuart. I write this column on the evening after our May 17, Bi-Annual Congregational Meeting at which SNUUC's membership nominated and approved three of dedicated members – Rosemary Olander-Beach, Brian Larkin, and Jean Smyth-Crocetto - to undertake the important task of searching for our next minister. The work required to undertake a ministerial search is great, but so is the reward in knowing that SNUUC's membership has entrusted these individuals with such a key role for shaping SNUUC's future.

At the Congregational Meeting, we approved our budget for the 2015-2016 fiscal year that runs from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016. Thanks to the hard work of our Treasurer Ellen Zaehringer-Gach and the Finance Committee, we continue to take the necessary steps to get SNUUC's fiscal house on firmer footing. We all appreciated Ellen's thorough and frank assessment of SNUUC's financial condition. However, know that we as a Board can only do so much to balance SNUUC's budget. The real effort and drive must come from SNUUC's membership in the form of increased pledges, increased donations to the offering plate, ideas for fund raising, and ways to increase our Thrift Shop's revenues.

Finally, we are reevaluating our Religious Education program. I provided at the Congregational Meeting an update on the process the Board intends to follow in evaluating SNUUC's RE program. We will assess our current program, understand and collect models of innovative and emerging RE programming, develop the right program for SNUUC and then determine that program's personnel needs.

It is a time of transition and change at SNUUC. Your Board of Trustees is working hard and enjoying the ride. And as we enter into our summer season, I leave you with the following thought that we UU's already know intuitively:

Last year the service was held on Sunday, November 16, at the First Presbyterian Church in Port Jefferson. The Transgender Day of Remembrance was set aside to memorialize those who were killed because of anti-transgender hatred or prejudice. The event is held in November to honor Rita Hester, whose murder on November 28, 1998, provided the impetus for the Remembering Our Dead Web project, http:// www.gender.org/remember/about/core.html and a San Francisco candlelight vigil in 1999.
